

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures closed mixed to mostly lower while feeders closed higher The futures discount to cash, along with ideas the market was oversold pushed live cattle higher on the opening and limited selling pressure Feeders surged to session highs on the opening as prices were supported by active buying and strong demand for replacement

ACRES HOG UPDATE: The pork complex closed sharply higher to limit up today with light interior movement yesterday and renewed speculation as to the availability of market hogs sparking rallies Buying in the bellies was linked to ideas that supplies were drying up and ideas of higher price movement throughout the week Ideas of higher prices also encouraged buying

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures settled mostly lower on late weakness from the soybean and corn pits Support throughout the session was provided by the CCC's new wheat catalog, which is expected to be relesed this week. The catalog will contain more hard red, which was supportive to Chicago Board of Trade futures today

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybeans settled mixed to mostly lower in slow indecisive trading as participants looked for clearer direction on the weather. Some commercial buying, linked to Taiwan's tenders lent support thr oughoutthe session Light farmer selling continues which has been supportive to the old crop months. The July option closed up 1-1/2 cents while September, November and January closed down from 2 to 2-1/2 cents

ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures closed lower on a selling spree late in the session. Mixed weather ideas failed to support deferred months on the close, coupled with overnight rains. Strength in the July option came from a brighter nearterm export outlook, although gains were limited by liquidation in front of last trading day Further support to the old crop months was provided by light farmer selling Generic Certificate premiums today are steady at 106-3/4% to 107-1/2%.
