

Haughland To Head Bureau Of Ag Development

HARRISBURG—A native Pennsylvanian with in-depth experience in administration and marketing will direct a new program linking the state's rural areas to Gov. Robert P. Casey's Economic Development Partnership. Agriculture Secretary Boyd E. Wolff announced today the appointment of Paul Haughland, who managed a regional economic development program for the state of Oregon, as head of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Agriculture Development.

"The Bureau of Agriculture Development will fill a key role in the department's policy to revitalize Pennsylvania's rural areas," Wolff said. "In turn, that effort to improve the agricultural economy is a major component of the governor's Economic Development Partnership."

"Paul Haughland is well-qualified to help us shape, fine-tune and implement a well-rounded program," Wolff continued. "He has demonstrated creative ability in drafting economic development plans and in carrying them through to completion; he is a man of action, the type of person who thrives on challenges," the Secretary said.

As bureau director, Haughland's chief concerns will be the creation of new jobs in the agricultural sector and upgrading those aspects of rural life that can be enhanced by better educational programs and improved health care, Wolff said.

Haughland, a native of Upland in Delaware County, moved with his parents to Florida as a teenager and attended high school in St. Petersburg.

His studies in the University of

Florida's College of Agriculture were interrupted by service in the Air Force from 1958-61. He received a bachelor's degree in agronomy from the university in 1963 and subsequently was employed as a turf grass agronomist with the St. Petersburg parks department.

From 1965 to 1968 he was a marketing representative for Chevron Chemical Co. in Ohio, specializing in agricultural chemicals.

While program manager for the state of Washington's Ecology Department in 1968-75, Haughland

developed a "one-stop permit" system that helped industries in their efforts to meet the state's environmental regulatory requirements. This program was subsequently adopted by other states.

He was recruited by Oregon's state government in 1975 and introduced the same type of program for the governor's office. He later was named manager of regional operations for Oregon's Economic Development Department, where his work focused on expanding the economies of the state's many rural communities.

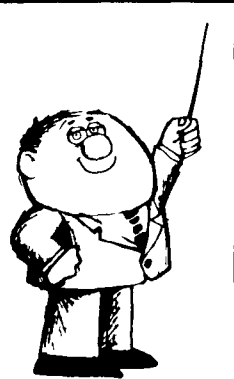
