DELMARVA BROILER FRYER MARKET:

MOVEMENT OF READY-TO-COOK WHOLE BIRDS WAS IMPROVED AND GENERALLY FAIR. OFFERINGS WERE IN A BIT BETTER BALANCE AND STILL COMPETITIVELY PRICED BUT NOT AS SHARPLY DISCOUNTED AS EARLIER IN THE WEEK. IN THE PARTS COMPLEX DEMAND WAS ALSO IMPROVED. SUPPLIES WERE IN BETTER BALANCE AND AT LEAST ADEQUATE ON MOST ITEMS. LESS THAN TRUCKLOT ASKING PRICES WERE 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER AT 41 TO 53 CENTS. LIVE SUPPLIES WERE AT LEAST MODERATE. WEIGHTS RANGED DESIRABLE TO LIGHT SLAUGHTER SCHEDULES WERE MODERATELY HEAVY THE UNDER-TONE ALTHOUGH IMPROVED REMAINED WEAK.

GLANCE. PRICES WERE GENERALLY UNCHANGED EXCEPT MEDIUMS AT EASTERN TERMINAL MARKETS TRENDED HIGHER. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY WITH SOME WEAKNESS NOTED ON LARGE IN PARTS OF THE MID ATLANTIC AND MIDWEST. WITH RETAIL FEATURES, DEMAND WAS MODERATE TO GOOD, ELSEWHERE DEMAND WAS QUIET TO FAIR. SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE ON MOST SIZES EXCEPT JUMBOS WERE USUALLY SHORT AND EXTRA LARGE AND MEDIUMS WERE BARE-LY ADEQUATE IN PARTS OF THE MIDWEST. BREAKERS CONTINUED TO UNAGRESSIVELY BID LOWER FOR THE AMPLE OFFERINGS.


