## **Shorthorn Juniors In National Show**

The National Junior Shorthorn Show and Youth Conference, held July 7-10 in Terre Haute, In., proved to be one of the largest and most well attended National Junior Shorthorn events in its history, combining extreme quality of cattle, deep in every class, and a very enthusiastic group of junior Shorthorn breeders, actively involved in promoting their breed. Eighteen states were represented in the week's activities accounting for 181 heifers and 73 steers vying for the National Junior Shorthorn titles. Placing the show's some 254 entries were Tom Stewman, Maryneal, Tx., and Martin Stanley, Bleiblerville. Tx.

The heifer show brought together some of the most exciting genetics from across the entire country from Pennsylvania to Oregon and North Dakota to Texas. The coveted Grand Champion honors went to Mary Jett, Beaver, Ok., on her July '86 heifer, GS Roan Betty DP86, a very fault free, complete, super patterned female sired by GS Deerpark ET, the 1985 All-American summer yearling

bull (whose dam GS Prairie Pearl D 80 was the 1981 National Junior Show Grand Champion female) and out of GS Red Betty M83. Stewman earlier selected her as the Summer Champion. She carried the impressive statistics of 900 pounds with 2.51 pound WDA and measured 52.75 inches for a 7.9 frame score. Jett also went on to capture the best pair of females with her Grand Champion, entry GS Roan Betty DP86 and GS Lady Calypson DP86, a May '86 female also sired by GS Deerpark ET.

The Reserve Grand Champion title went to the Junior Champion female, CSF Maine Lady 86, shown by Kevin Sugden, Rockford, Ill. This powerful, spring yearling was sired by CSF Big Event 78 and was out of CSF Alpha MA. CSF Maine Lady 86 was a stout made, heavy muscled, high volumed April '86 heifer with a world of performance and correctness. She weighed 1,200 pounds with a 2.61 pound WDA and was

Ted Vinson, Fithian, Il., took his Class 12 winner, TV Miss Liberty, a March '86 female, to the winners circle. TV Miss Liberty was a very angular, large framed female sired by the 1986 All-American senior yearling bull, CC Cujo x.

The track remained fast in steer competition as Matt Carrothers, Coggan, Ia., and "Pete," a March '86 son of JBS Astronaut x, received the nod from judge Marthick, complete calf weighed 1,230 AF Dividend's Impact pounds with a 2.54 pound WDA; thick, stylish, super patterned steer and was 56 inches tall. Stanley then selected Waukaru Elevation 637 with Brett McMullen, Rock-

ville, In., at the halter, to the Reserve Grand Champion market steer banner. The March '8 son of Willow Crest Elevation x weighed 1,205 pounds for a WDA of 2.52 pounds and was 54.5 inches tall.

The prospect steer show proved to be one of the more popular divisions of the whole show, and the competition continued at a high level. Colby Horn, Lookeba, Ok., with HB Piper at his side, walked away as the Grand Champion prosthat weighed 865 pounds with a 2.55 pound WDA and was 50.5 inches tall. The Reserve Champion

prospect steer followed the pattern of the Champion steer very closely as Stanley chose Justin Lierle, Hydro, Ok., with CV Golden Image Spike to receive the banner. This super profiled son of M&S Golden Image weighed 650 pounds for a 2.24 pound WDA and was 48 inches at the hip.

In the appendix division the Champion Steer was GR 165, an April '86 son of Cartwright ET. The steer weighed 1,215 pounds for a WDA of 2.63 pounds and was 55 inches tall. The steer was owned by Kevin Sugden, the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion female. The Reserve Champion




