

Local Farmers Play Host At City Zoo

SOUTHAMPTON, Pa. — John and Gail Frederick, dairy farmers from New Hope, took their milking skills to Philadelphia.

The Fredericks put on a special demonstration for visitors to the Children's Zoo. They explained the milking process to their young

audience, as "Moochelle," one of the zoo's two cows, was milked by machine.

They also answered questions about dairying and life on the farm and distributed farm literature. In sharing information with their audience, the Fredericks explained

how a cow converts feed, water and time to produce wholesome, nutritious milk.

The Fredericks are among a dozen farm families who will participate in this special program, which is held at noon every Sunday during the summer.

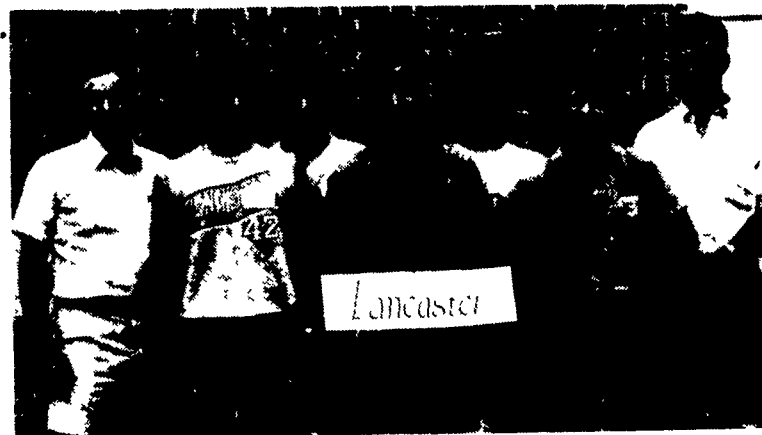
These farmers are members of Atlantic Dairy Cooperative and participate in the Young Cooperator's program, which is designed to teach young farmers about cooperative business and the dairy

College of Agriculture, Penn State University; The Pennsylvania Association of Farmer Cooperatives; and numerous local cooperative councils.

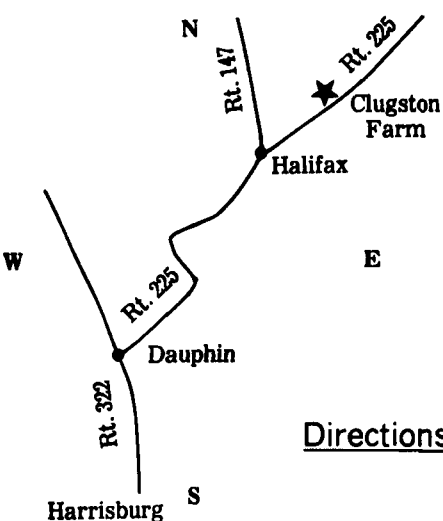
Nearly 180 scholars and adult advisors from four states attended this year's institute.
