Lovell Sisters Sweep Lycoming Livestock Competitions

HUGHESVILLE — In the annals of the youth livestock shows of Lycoming County Fair 1987 will be remembered as the year the Lovell sisters, Annette, Angela, and Laura, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Lovell, R.D., Linden swept the youth beef, lamb and swine competitions.

Sixteen-year-old Annette Lovell won the youth beef show with her Chi-Angus brindle steer, Bobtail, while her sister, Angela, 9, placed second by showing her Polled Hereford steer, Trix. Middle sister, Laura Lovell, 12, captured top honors in the market lamb competition with her lamb, Adam, and to round things out walked off with the grand champion trophy in the youth swine show. To sum things up, an unprecedented four of the top six places in the youth livestock competition this year went to members of one family.

Annette reports her 18-month-old Chi-Angus cross grand champion steer was sired by Pine Drive Big Sky. Her steer, Bobtail, won the show because of his muscling, according to Annette. "I think it was the steer's muscling. They really look for that. They don't like fat."

Annette and her sisters are members of the Bottle Run 4-H. Annette has been a participant of 4-H for the past seven years, showing chiefly steers and lambs and a

few pigs. She has several wins to her credit and lists a previous grand championship each in the 4-H and open beef shows, and two grand champion trophies in the market lamb competition plus an overall showmanship award in the sheep competition among her trophies.

What Annette enjoys best about showing in 4-H is, "The competition-- trying to beat

whomever had it last year." Her least favorite part, she says, is "Leaving them after they're sold." Offering advice on how to win, she considers conformation the most important item. "You gotta pick out the right calf in the beginning."

Nine-year old Angela Lovell attributes her second-place win in the youth beef show with her

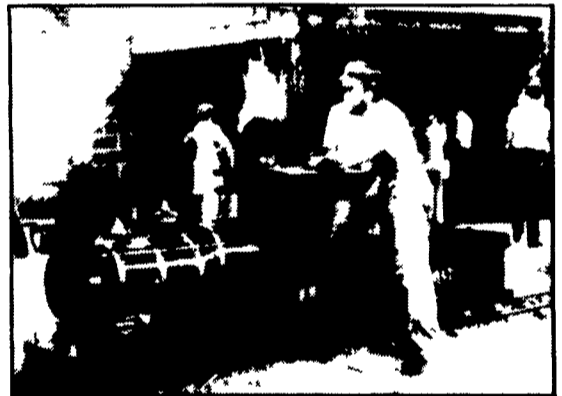
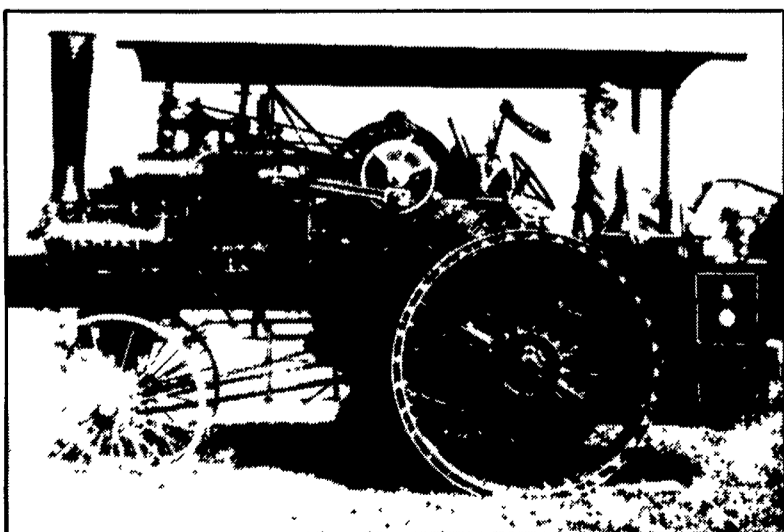

Rough and Tumble is a museum dedicated to preserving equipment powered by several sources and used for everyday tasks in industry and on the farm. During the Threshermen's Reunion everything that will run is demonstrated.

This year's special engine exhibit will highlight the Minneapolis-Moline line of farm machines.

The Parade of Power, a daily event at R & T's reunions, features many early gas-powered engines plus a collection of steam-powered machinery matched nowhere east of the Mississippi River.

A whole building will be devoted to model machinery, running on steam power, and miniature railroad enthusiasts may run their own Guage #1-3/4 "45 mm steam locomotives on an outside track.

NEW FEATURE

A new feature of this year's reunion will be a children's pedal tractor pull on Thursday evening. Rough and Tumble provides the pedal tractor and the skid, just to keep things even for all participants.

There is an operating saw mill, a shingle mill, and a stone crusher operating on the grounds - all steam powered. Two steam powered trains also operate, one an amusement park miniature, the other a Shay logging, locomotive with an added "passenger car". The larger train circles the grounds, going past time-honored craftsmen like the chair caner and the broom maker, past a vast flea market area of homemade items, farm specialties and machinery parts.
