

Chairman Daughter Sells To Top Sire Power Sale

KUTZTOWN — A 3-year-old Cal-Clark Board Chairman daughter sold for \$22,000 to top the annual Sire Power Sale held here Wednesday.

Dean-C-T Chairman Linda carries a Cow Index of plus 1,877 milk, plus 60 fat, plus 59 protein, plus \$201, and plus \$189 cheese yield as calculated in the July index. Purchased by the Amelia Bovine Clinic Syndicate, Amelia, Va., the VG-86 cow sold with an AI contract on the calf she is carry-

ing by Enhancer. Four additional AI organizations as well as domestic and foreign ET buyers have expressed interest in offspring from Linda.

In 346 days, the consignment from Charles Dean's herd in Ridgely, Md., produced a record of 27,370 pounds of milk and 1,017 pounds of fat. "This animal puts it all together — numbers, production, pedigree and type," Horace Backus proclaimed after citing Linda's credits.

Her dam, Dean-C-T Bell Lizzy,

GP-84, owns a Cow Index of plus 1,528 milk, plus 55 fat, plus \$174, plus 49 protein, and plus \$174 cheese yield. Sired by Carlin-M Ivanhoe Bell, Lizzy completed two lactations over 20,000 pounds of milk.

Dean-C-T Elevation Lassie, the second dam, classified VG-87 at 6 years of age and carries a Cow Index of plus 1,089 milk, plus 45 fat, plus \$133, and plus 34 protein. The Elevation daughter owns a top milk record of 35,550 pounds and a top fat record of 1,150 pounds.

The next dam, by Ivanhoe, produced over 200,000 pounds of milk in her lifetime.

A 6-month-old granddaughter of the Faith cow sold for the second highest price of \$13,500. Born Jan. 3, 1987, Plushanski Ned Boy Fedora-ET sold to Stanley and Kitty Dunn, Charleston, W.V., owners of Dolly-Varden Farm. Charles Plushanski, Kutztown, consigned the Whittier Farms Ned Boy daughter.

Fedora's dam, Plushanski Nugget Fobes-ET, ranks fourth on the January CTPI list with a CTPI of plus 1,239. Her Cow Index stands at plus 1,674 milk, plus 125 fat, plus \$299, plus 72 protein, and plus \$337 cheese yield. Fobes completed a high lactation of 33,471 pounds of milk, 1,746 pounds of fat, and 1,197 pounds of protein in 365 days. Sired by Cedar-Grove Golden Nugget, she owns two additional records over 27,000 pounds of milk and 1,300 pounds of fat. Maternal sisters to Fobes have produced records ranging from 4.1 to 5.2 fat tests and over 30,000 pounds of milk.

Plushanski Chief Faith classified 4E, EX-94, GMD and carries a Cow Index of plus 1,406 milk, plus 99 fat, and plus \$241 with a CTPI of plus 1,013. She completed a best effort of 37,718 pounds of milk and 1,913 pounds of fat with a 5.1 test as a 9 year old. Faith's lifetime credits stand at 242,863 pounds of milk and 11,353 pounds of fat.

Bay-Road Ned Boy Pride-ET commanded the third high price of \$6,200 and sold to Michael Gillis,

Argyle, N.Y. Appleton Farms, Ipswich, Mass., consigned the October 1986 calf which was sired by Whittier Farms Ned Boy.

Her dam, Juniper-Mist Bell Paula owns a Cow Index of plus 1,920 milk, plus 100 fat, and plus \$270 with a CTPI of plus 1,147. Classified VG-88, the Bell daughter produced several Massachusetts fat records and completed a top record of 31,750 pounds of milk and 1,388 pounds of fat.

The second dam, Juniper-Mist Arlinda Amanda, VG-88, produced a top record of 24,260 pounds of milk and 1,082 pounds of fat. The next dam, an EX-2E Elevation daughter, produced a high lactation of 33,230 pounds of milk and 1,531 pounds of fat.

Curti Farms, Waukena, Calif., purchased Art Acres Kay O Ned Boy-ET for \$6,100. Arthur Rhoderick, Hagerstown, Md., consigned Sept. 2, 1986 calf sired by Ned Boy.

The sale averaged \$3,132 on 56 lots.

The sale was dedicated to Willard Odenwelder and Leighton Klingler, district managers for Sire Power. These men will be retiring at the end of the year after 77 years of combined service.

Rensburg Sale Service co-managed the sale with Backus Associates Inc. Denny Rensburg and Mike Weimer shared the auctioneering assignment. Norman Hill and Jay Howes completed the sale force.
