Lebanon Fair Color Breeds Dairy Show

The Ayrshire show at the Lebanon Area Fair was dominated by Dale Maulfair of Jonestown. Maulfair captured grand and reserve champion female titles, champion herd and first place in the dam and daughter class.

Judge Jerome Myers of Delaware Valley College picked Maulfair Acres Oracle Dena, as the champion female. She was sired by Hammonds Oracle and produced 15,000 lbs. last year. The reserve champion, Maulfair Acres Jewel Dena, is a sister to the champion. Both cows are homebred.

A newcomer to the Brown Swiss show took both grand and reserve champion female titles with her FFA projects. Fifteenyear-old Teresa Hill, Lebanon, moved with her family from Sussex County, NJ in March and brought her prize winning dairy stock with her. Hill's three-yearold, Little Hill Maples Marge, sired by Maple Grove Performer, was given champion honors by judge Lori Sollenberger.

"The competition is a lot tougher here," Hill commented. "It is good to see if one's cows really can stand the challenge.'

Lebanon Valley Star Veri, a five-year-old dry cow, took a trip to the winners circle for Robert Smith & Sons, Annville, winning the champion Guernsey female title. Veri is classified at 88 and is working on a two year production record of 17,000 lbs. with 750 lbs. of butter fat.

Robert Smith & Sons milk 65 Guernseys which produces the raw ingredients for their family owned dairy store, Ja-Mar Dairy.

The reserve champion of the Guernsey show was Lebanon Valley Fayette Gail shown by Thomas Hostetter II, Annville. Gail won the junior two-year-old class and was sired by Dutch Mill Telestars Fayette.

Blue Mountain Jersey's threeyear-old cow Blue Mountain Lucky Clover, captured grand champion female honor at the Jersey show. The home-bred entry sired by Headspring Thor also was named best udder. Clover was bred by Mr. and Mrs. Paul Longenecker of Mifflinburg and was named FFA champion.

The reserve champion Top-O-Hill Special Mingo Bambi, was owned by Melanie Bushong, Lebanon. Sired by Top-O-Mill Criterion, Bambi took first place in the senior two-year-old class.

College Sets Dairy Judging Conference

The 18th annual Alfred State College Future Farmers of America (FFA) Dairy Judging Conference will be staged Tuesday, Aug. 11, at three sites in Cattaraugus County.

The daylong event will draw entrants from New York, Pennsylvania, and Ohio with youngsters competing in teams and individually, said coordinator Thomas J. Cannon, assistant professor in the Plant and Animal Science Department at Alfred State. He is being assisted by David A. Smith, associate professor in the department.

Registration begins at 8:30 a.m. at Hill's Valley Farms, New Albion, where Brown Swiss and Ayrshires will be judged starting at 9:30 a.m. During the afternoon, Brown Swiss and Holsteins will be judged at El-A-Ray Farms starting at 12:45 p.m. and Jerseys will be judged at Eagle Val Jerseys starting at 2:45 p.m. Both sites are in East Otto.

An awards ceremony is scheduled for 3:45 p.m., with participants and their advisers departing for home at 4 p.m., Professor Cannon said.

Registration fees for the conference are \$7 per team or \$2 for individuals (persons whose schools are not represented by teams). Participants are advised to bring bag lunches, with milk and cookies to be provided.
