DEMAND FOR READY-TO-COOK WHOLE BIRDS WAS IRREGULAR BUT GENERALLY NO BETTER THAN MODERATE. OFFERINGS RANGED IN GOOD BALANCE TO FULLY ADEQUATE DEMAND IN THE PARTS COMPLEX HAD SLOWED ON WHITE MEAT AND MOST SELLERS HAD LESS DIFFICULTY MEETING ORDERS. LEGS AND LEG QUARTERS WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE WITH LEGS IN HEAVIEST SUPPLY. WINGS WERE IN BETTER BALANCE WITH DEMAND AND THE DISCOUNTING OF EARLIER IN THE WEEK HAD DISAPPEARED LESS THAN TRUCKLOT ASKING PRICES WERE UNCHANGED AT 43 TO 55 CENTS LIVE SUPPLIES WERE MODERATE WEIGHTS WERE INCREASING OVERALL BUT STILL RANGE DESIRABLE TO LIGHT SLAUGHTER SCHEDULES WERE MODERATE THE UNDERTONE WAS STEADY

MEDIUM PRICES DECLINED AT EASTERN TERMINAL MARKETS, UNCHANGED ELSEWHERE PRICES ON LARGE SIZES WERE UNCHANGED UNDER A GENERALLY STEADY MARKET TONE. DEMAND FOR CARTONED EGGS WAS QUIET TO MODERATE, BETTER WITH FEATURES AND IN VACATION AREAS. ** ** SUPPLIES OF THE HEAVY SIZES WERE TIGHT, LARGE WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE IN SOME AREAS AND MEDIUMS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE WITH SURPLUS OFFERED TO THE BREAKERS. 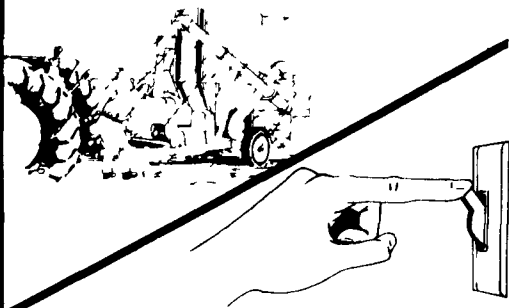
