Darlene Tops South Central Show

SHIPPENSBURG — Globe-Run Sexy Darlene, a three-yearold Ocean-View Sexation daughter captured all the top awards at the South Central Pennsylvania Championship Show August 10. Owner John Foster III, Petersburg, took home the Youth Senior and Grand Champion trophies and the Senior and Grand Champion trophies. His animal was also named Best Bred and Owned by Exhibitor. Darlene, a 91 point cow with an excellent mammary, has a two-year-old record of 20,000 lbs. of milk and 800 of fat. As a three year old, she produced 111 lbs. of milk with a 4.6 percent test on her high day. She was named Grand Champion at the Morrison's Cove Dairy Show in Blair County this month, and also Grand Champion of the 4-H show there. As a Senior Yearling, she was nominated for All-American honors, and was All-Pennsylvania Senior Yearling in 1985. In 1986, she was named All-Pennsylvania Senior two year old.

A Junior two-year-old bred and owned by James and Nina Burdette, Mercersburg, was named Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champion. Windy Knoll View Ultimate Pala, a Quality Ultimate daughter, was named All-Pennsylvania Junior Yearling in 1986. Her dam, Windy Knoll View Creek Pauline, is classified 88 with an Excellent Mammary.

Penn-Gate Farm of Littlestown, owned by Robert Gitt and daughter and son-in-law Christine and Steve Wood, was named Premier Exhibitor and Breeder.

In the Youth division, the Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champion titles were captured by Maybia Miller Farm Willow Suzi, an aged cow owned by Holly Welty of Mt. Joy. A 90 point cow, Suzi was Grand Champion of the Lancaster County 4-H Show in 1987, and Grand Champion of the New York State Southern Tier District Show in 1986. At 6 years and 8 months, she produced 34,000 pounds of milk in 365 days with a four percent test and 1400 pounds

Windy Knoll View Lotsa Quality, a Senior Yearling heifer owned by James and Nina Burdette, was the show's Junior Champion. Reserve Champion and Youth-Junior Champion was Aldina Magic Gigi, owned by Beverly Meyers, Chambersburg. An Intermediate Yearling heifer, she was sired by Romandale Magic.

Reserve Junior Champion of the Youth show was Meadow-Vu Dynamic Star-Red, a Junior Heifer calf owned by Thomas Eckstine of Mercersburg.

Champion bull at the show was a Junior Yearling bull bred and owned by John Bomgardner of Ono, Loving Meadows Pinocchio. Reserve Champion bul was Aldina Concord Arnie, a Junior bull calf owned by Aldina Holsteins,
