SHELL EGGS IN NEW ENGLAND: FEDERAL-STATE.

PRICES WERE HIGHER ON LOOSE LARGE AND ALL CARTONED SIZES, UNCHANGED ON THE BALANCE. THE MARKET TONE REMAINED FULLY STEADY TO FIRM. MOVEMENT OF CARTONED EGGS CONTINUED GOOD. LARGE AND EXTRA LARGE WERE IN GOOD BALANCE TO CLOSELY CLEARED. MEDIUMS WERE ABOUT ADEQUATE. JUMBOS WERE SHORT. INQUIRY FOR GRADEABLE RECEIPTS WAS ACTIVE AND DIFFICULT TO FILL, PARTICULARLY ON PACKS YIELDING THE LARGE AND HEAVIER WEIGHT SIZES.

NEW YORK AND PHILADELPHIA FROZEN EGG REPORT: FEDERAL STATE.

PRICES WERE GENERALLY UNCHANGED WITH WHOLE EGG IN A FIRMER POSITION AND WHITES CONTINUED IN THE WEAKEST POSITION. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY TO FULLY STEADY. DEMAND IMPROVED AND WAS MOSTLY MODERATE. FLOOR STOCKS WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE. RAW MATERIAL COSTS TRENDED HIGHER AS THE SHELL EGG MARKET FIRMED AND HEAVY BREAKING STOCK WAS DIFFICULT TO LOCATE.

DEMAND FOR READY-TO-COOK WHOLE BIRDS WAS LIGHT AND UNAGGRESSIVE. SUPPLIES WERE AMPLE TO BURDENSOME. IN THE PARTS COMPLEX PRICES WERE TRENDING LOWER AS DEALERS SOUGHT LEVELS SUFFICIENT TO STIMULATE DEMAND. LESS THAN TRUCKLOT ASKING PRICES WERE 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER AT 53 TO 62 CENTS AND PRICES WERE STILL NEGOTIABLE AT SEVERAL PLANTS. LIVE SUPPLIES WERE GENERALLY MODERATE. WEIGHTS DESIRABLE TO LIGHT. SLAUGHTER SCHEDULES WERE MODERATELY HEAVY. THE UNDERTONE WAS WEAK AND UNSETTLED.
