

South-Central 4-Hers Earn Dairy Show Championships

HARRISBURG — The South-Central District 4-H Dairy Show, held Tuesday, August 23, in the Farm Show Building, hosted many familiar names from previous

years. However, by the time the final judging was completed previous champions gave way to some new names to the championship line-up.

Denise Martin of Chambersburg in Franklin County took the grand champion title in the Jersey division. Her three-year old, Fortunes Golden Legacy, was sired by Golden Faithful. Tom Arrowsmith of Peach Bottom in Lancaster County, took the reserve champion spot.

In the Holstein division the daughter of Dale-Pride Glendell Monique took the grand champion title. This senior 2-year-old, Dale-Pride Monique Roxie was exhibited by Becky Hostetter of York.

Holstein Judge Dennis Patrick from Maryland, selected Hostetter's animal on her tremendously attached udder and on her excellent bone structure. The reserve grand champion this year went to Tom McCauley's 4-year-old Metcalfs Valiant Beauty-ET. McCauley is from Elizabethtown.

Dauphin County's Debra Shetterly nearly swept the titles in the Ayrshire division. Her dry cow senior, Sycamore-meade Lock's Lovely took the grand champion

laurels. Judge Patrick chose this dry cow for her beautifully attached udder and for her height and width. Shetterly's senior 2-year-old, Sycamore-Meade Champs Renie took reserve grand champion. Shetterly's intermediate class winner took the junior champion in the Ayrshire division. It was Angela Spickler's senior calf in the reserve junior champion spot. Spickler is of Mt. Joy.
