Tops Corn Contest

SAYLORSBURG — A Monroe County farmer won first place in the no-till division of the National Corn Growers Association yield contest.

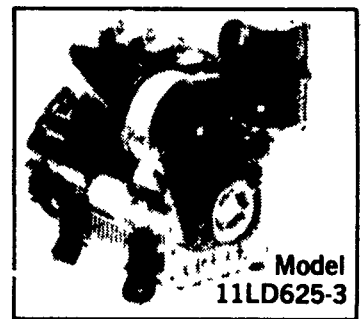
Rodger Nordmeyer produced 178.13 bushels an acre on his farm during last year's harvest using Pioneer® hybrid 3352 and earned first place in the no-till division for the state of Pennsylvania. He outyielded the second place winner by more than seven bushels an acre.

Results of the contest were announced earlier this year, however many of the winners received

additional recognition at the NCGA Corn Classic in Minneapolis, Minn.
