
The proposed agricultural preserves would make land owners eligible to voluntarily sell a conservation easement to the Agricultural Preserve Board and establish protective right to farm policies. Several Colerain land owners have requested that the ag preserve be proposed.

Agricultural preserves are created because state law requires that the Agricultural Preserve Board identify priority farm land areas in which to spend preservation dollars.

The purpose of the public meetings will be to inform land owners and answer questions about the effects of the Agricultural Preserve Board and the voluntary conservation easement program.
