## THIS WEEK

- The Pennsylvania drought appeared to be moving westward as some regions reported poor crop conditions for the week ended Monday, the State Department of Agriculture said Wednesday.

Scattered areas from Indiana to Fayette Counties and into Lawrence County reported wilted corn, poor hay crops and burned pastures. This has been the general

condition of crops in southeastern Pennsylvania for more than a month, observers said.

- Russet Mites, found in Lancaster County, this year for the first time in three years, pose a threat to the tomato grower, according to Associate Agent Harry S. Sloat.

Sloat told growers at a series of meetings last week that the insect is of nearly microscopic size and

multiplies at a tremendous rate during hot weather. Its presence can be detected by general bronzing or yellowing of the tomato plant stem and leaves.

- Now Is The Time... to beware of poisonous plants. Nightshade, buttercups, milkweed, pokeberries, hemlock and celandine are common to this area and will kill if consumed.

- Now Is The Time... to cut forage crops when ready, to consider dual wheat... to wait for moisture for summer seedings... to make plans for covering horizontal silos.
