SLAUGH-TER STEERS AND HEIFERS WERE STEADY AT VIRGINIA AUCTIONS AS WELL AS MIDWEST MARKETS. BOX-**ED BEEF PRICES WERE \$1.09 LOWER** THAN LAST WEEK AS BOXED BEEF CUT-OUT VALUE REACHED \$101.26/CWT MONDAY. COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA AUCTIONS WERE STEADY TO WEAK WHILE MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$2.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION LAST WEEK WAS 3.7% BELOW THE PREVIOUS WEEK AND 5 PERCENT BELOW A YEAR AGO AVERAGE


