SUPPLIES ARE LIMITED ON YOLK AND MANY BREAKERS ARE NOT EAGER TO SEPARATE. WHOLE AND WHITES ARE USUALLY IN GOOD BALANCE FOR THE CURRENT DEMAND.

ACRES HOG UPDATE: Live hogs and pork bellies settled mostly higher on spillover strength from outside markets and the cattle pits. Small gains were made on buying enthusiasm from the cattle pits in an otherwise lackluster session. Most of the pit wants to be bearish, but the discount to cash hogs has dampened selling enthusiasm and left many traders sidelined.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle and feeder cattle futures closed higher this afternoon, but off session highs boosted by firmer-than-expected cash fundamentals. Some profit-taking near the close pared earlier gains. Fed cattle prices held firm today, with a major packer who had been out of the market re-entering today at steady prices. October was left on cash-connected unwinding of bear spreads, with buying in October and selling of February.

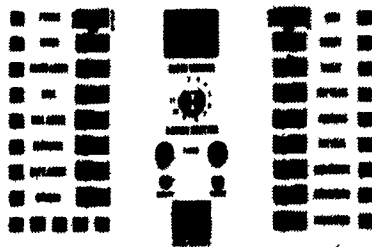
