LOUIS MARKET CLOSED STEADY TO 1 CENT HIGHER. YELLOW CORN TRADED 2 CENTS HIGHER AT KANSAS CITY, DOWN 1/2 CENT AT MINNEAPOLIS, UP 2 TO 3 CENTS AT OMAHA AND UP 3 CENTS PER BUSHEL AT SOUTHERN IOWA POINTS.
