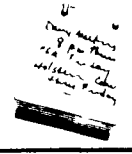

Order No. 4 Class I Milk Price \$14.30 For October

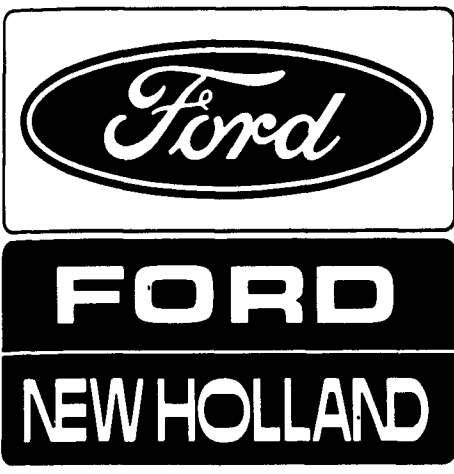
ALEXANDRIA, VA — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Joseph D. Shine today announced a Class I milk price of \$14.30 per hundredweight for October 1987. This price is up 10 cents from September but is 6 cents below last October's Class I price.

Mr. Shine announced a Class II milk price of \$11.39 per hundredweight for August 1987 and a butterfat differential of 17.0 cents for the month. The Class II price was up 17 cents from the previous month, while the butterfat diffe-

rential decreased one-tenth of a cent.

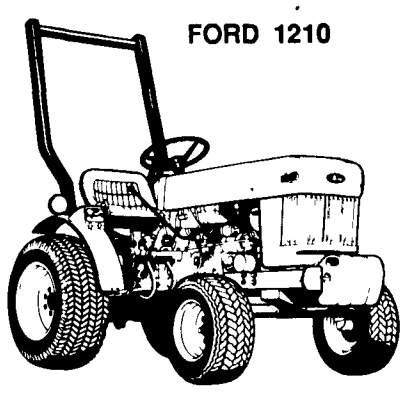
The October 1987 Class I price and the August 1987 Class II price are based on the August 1987 Minnesota-Wisconsin manufacturing milk price of \$11.27 per hundredweight at a 3.5 percent butterfat content.

The USDA reported that the wholesale price of Grade A butter at Chicago for August was \$1.4812 per pound and the nonfat dry milk price was \$.7987 per pound, f.o.b. plants in the Chicago area.
