ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures settled higher again this afternoon on buying generated by light midwestern farmer selling. Further strength was added by yesterday's higher-than-expected export inspections, with further gains pared by USDA's announcement that \$2.0 billion dollars in generic certificates for advanced deficiency payments would be issued October 1st. The December option posted gains of 1-3/4 cents, settling at \$1.73-3/4.

ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybeans settled from

3/4 to 2-1/4 cents lower this afternoon after trading higher throughout the session. Profit-taking near the close and lower soybean quotes put soybeans on the defensive. Nearby months were pressured by talk of an increase in farmer selling and the proximity to CCC resale levels in some locations. Support early in the session was linked to active follow-through buying from yesterday's strong close. A slightly higher dollar weighed on soybean along with overbought conditions, and ideas that European demand may soon

abate.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures settled higher, but off session highs on selling associated with profit-taking. The continued talk of quality concerns in European wheat underpinned prices along with ideas that the Soviet Union might be looking at another 2.0 to 4.0 MMT of US wheat under the export bonus program. Further support came from steady to higher Gulf basis levels and yesterday's higher-than-expected weekly export inspections. Prices rose from 1-3/4 cent to 3-1/2 cents today with the December closing at \$2.96-1/2, up 2-1/2.

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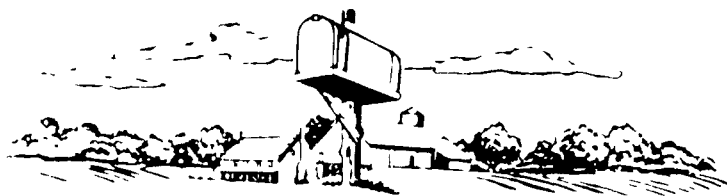
