SOYBEAN MARKETS ROSE 6-8 CENTS PER BUSHEL. CHICAGO OCTOBER SOYBEAN MEAL FUTURES MAKRET WENT UP \$3.20 AT \$174.60 PER TON AND OCTOBER OIL ROSE 4 POINTS. RAINS DELAYED NEW CROP HARVEST AND EXPORT DEMAND CONTINUED ACTIVE.
