## FUTURES MARKET TRENDS GRAIN AND LIVESTOCK

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**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn futures settled from unchanged in the deferred months to up 1 cent on the March option. Futures traded lower throughout the day, but staged a recovery late in the session on sustained strength in the soybean complex and fresh export business. Prices also found support from the expectations that South Korea's corn processing industry will tender for corn soon. Pressure came throughout the ses-

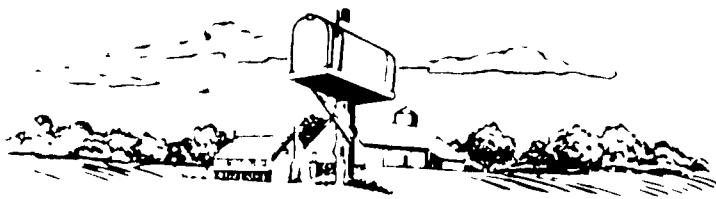
session with selling on ideas that the corn projection estimate yesterday from private forecaster Conrad Leslie was bearish along with declining Gulf basis levels.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybeans futures settled higher this afternoon at or near session highs on spillover strength from the soybean and bean oil pits. Renewed rumors of export bonus vegetable oil offers boosted oil prices early in the

session as meal posted small gains on spillover, but continued to remain sluggish on the near-term export picture. The fears of CCC bean resales helped to trim gains made in the November option, but talk emerged late in the session of that USSR may buy beans to make up for a deficit in their unseeded production. November closed up 4-3/4 cents at \$5.42-1/2.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures closed slightly higher this afternoon on spillover strength from the soybean complex. Prices were on the defensive throughout the session on news that the USSR was dissatisfied
