
ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures settled higher but closed off of daily highs on strength from rumors of major purchases of CCC stocks. Large commercials were noted buyers on the late break. Pipeline supplies continued to support the market as did stronger basis levels and higher

export inspec- tions. Certificate values remain steady with redemption rates rising leading to lower PIK and ROLL profits.

ACRES SOYBEAN **UPDATE:** Soybeans futures settled higher on strength in meal and soyoil. Aggressive commeri-

cal buying and broad-based speculative support was noted. Gains in November were limited by a weaker tone in the Gulf markets. Heavy selling was noticed as the November contract approached the \$5.50 level which is expected to trigger CCC resales.
