PRICES WERE MIXED UNDER A STEADY MARKET TONE. MOVEMENT OF ALL ITEMS WAS LIGHT TO FAIRLY GOOD WITH WHITES IN LEAST DEMAND. INTEREST IN WHOLE EGG WAS STIMULATED PARTIALLY BY LOWER PRICES. FLOOR STOCKS WERE ADEQUATE RAW MATERIALS CONTINUED TO BE READILY AVAILABLE AT GENERALLY UNCHANGED PRICES.

BREAST ITEMS REMAINED IN CLOSE BALANCE WHILE OTHER ITEMS WERE FULLY ADEQUATE TO AMPLE. LESS THAN TRUCKLOT ASKING PRICES WERE 1 CENT LOWER AT 37 TO 46 CENTS. NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:  
PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO HIGHER IN MAJOR NORTHEASTERN METROPOLITAN CENTERS, UNCHANGED ELSEWHERE. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY TO FIRM. CARTONED EGG DEMAND WAS POSITIVELY INFLUENCED BY RETAIL FEATURES AND WAS MODERATE TO GOOD OVERALL. INTEREST IN UNGRADED AND GRADED LOOSE OFFERINGS HAD IMPROVED. MEDIUM SUPPLIES WERE IRREGULAR FROM BARELY ADEQUATE IN PARTS OF THE NORTHEAST TO FULLY ADEQUATE IN PARTS OF THE MIDWEST. SUPPLIES OF THE LARGE SIZES WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE. BREAKER INTEREST IN RAW MATERIALS WAS FAIRLY GOOD AND MORE AGGRESSIVE THAN LAST WEEK IN THE MIDWEST WHILE FINISHED PRODUCT SALES WERE MODERATE TO GOOD. SPENT HEN OFFERINGS WERE LIGHT BUT ADEQUATE FOR A FAIR AND UNAGGRESSIVE BUYING INTEREST; PROCESSOR SCHEDULES WERE AT NORMAL CAPACITY.
