Another Route 23/30 Meeting Set

Another meeting to help clarify
the issues of the 23/30 bypass
through Lancaster County Amish
country is scheduled for Wednes-

day, October 28, at the Leola Fire
Hall according to Richard Arms-
trong, sponsor of the meetings.
Starting time is 7:30 p.m.

Three previous meetings
announced last week had an aver-
age attendance of 50 persons. And
others who would like more infor-
mation or who would like to

express their opinion to the state
are invited to this meeting. The
state has requested this input but
the questionnaire that was sent out is
reportedly lengthy and
complicated.

The present situation came
about when an overwhelming turn-
out of Amish farmers by their pre-
sence at a public meeting quietly
made their opposition to the high-
way known. Plans call for the state
to make its recommendations back
to the community in December.
