ACRES CORN UPDATE: Corn futures closed from 1/2 to 1-1/2 cents lower today, posting session lows in the closing minutes. Declines late in the session were linked to persistent nervousness over the Dow Jones, with trading in the corn pit mirroring outside market activity. Selling late in the session was tied to a lack of interest in holding large positions in such a choppy market, with price declines limited by strength in basis levels, slack movement and a strong export line-up. December closed at \$1 80-3/4, down 1-1/4 cent. Generic certifi-

cate premiums are steady at bids of 105-105-1/2% and offers of 106-106-1/2%

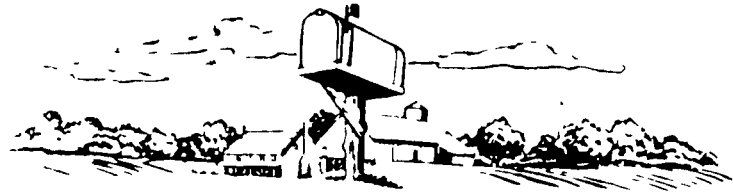
ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures prices settled mostly lower today with new session lows posted in the final minutes of trading. Buyers were discouraged by the ongoing gyrations of the Dow Jones and were hesitant to hold positions. November was pressured by long liquidation in front of first notice day, with ideas on potential deliveries varied. Firm cash markets and slack movement were support-

ive along with firm processor demand. November beans lost three cents, closing at \$5 35-3/4 with January posting a 3-1/2 cent loss at \$5 44-1/2

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures settled lower today from 1/2 to 3 cents pressured by the slow-moving Dow Jones. Further pressure came from selling tied to the positioning of hedges. Supportive to prices were higher Gulf basis levels and a bright near-term export line-up with Iraq and possibly the USSR. The December option closed one cent lower at \$2 95-3/4

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live cattle futures closed higher this afternoon supported by cash-connected buying as talk surfaced that fed cattle traded at \$67.00. Ideas that futures were oversold influenced
