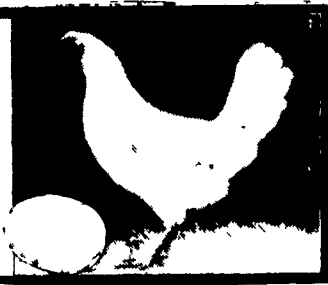

RIB BREASTS WERE ADEQUATE AND CLEARING SATISFACTORILY. LINE-RUN BREASTS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE, AND BUYERS WERE SHYING AWAY WHERE SELLERS ASKED HIGHER PRICES. LEGS AND LEG QUARTERS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE. WINGS WERE IN TIGHTER SUPPLY AND CONFIDENTLY HELD WHERE AVAILABLE.

## National Egg Market

**Wednesday, November 4, 1987**  
 NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:  
 PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS GENERALLY STEADY. RETAIL DEMAND FOR CARTONED EGGS WAS MOSTLY MODERATE BUT COVERED THE FULL RANGE. SUPPLIES OF ALL SIZES WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE WITH MEDIUMS SLOWEST TO CLEAR IN NORTHERN REGIONS. FLOOR STOCKS CONTINUED TO BE HELD WITH CONFIDENCE ALTHOUGH SOME CAUTIOUSNESS WAS NOTED DUE IN PART TO SLOWER THAN EXPECTED RETAIL DEMAND AND CLOSE TO A MILLION CASES IN THE NATIONAL INVENTORY. BREAKERS WERE GENERALLY UNAGGRESSIVE, BUT SOME PURCHASED RAW MATERIALS AT LOWER TRENDING PRICES. SPENT HEN MOVEMENT WAS LIGHT AND SHORT OF PROCESSOR NEEDS.

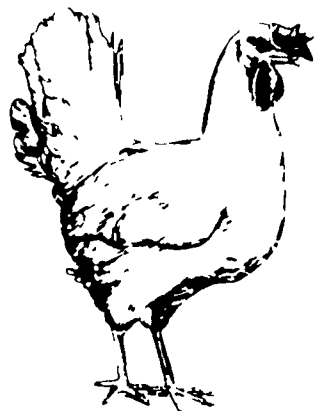
