Again, as she did last year and the year before that, Ellen Lewis swept the titles in the Hampshire breeding sheep competition. And

for her grand finale, Lewis again captured the coveted supreme championship award over all five breeds shown. Judged by Lee Wagner from Easton, Pennsylvania, Lewis Lewis was again selected for exhibiting the sheep best owned and bred.

Wendall Landis took the grand champion honors in the market lamb competition with his 129 lb. heavyweight champion market lamb. Landis is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Abram Landis of RD 7, Manheim. Carrie Groff took the reserve grand championship title with her 100 lb. lightweight champion. Groff is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Groff of RD 5,

Lewis' ewe lambs captured both the champion and reserve champion rosettes in the Hampshire division and also took first and second place in the yearling ewe class. These wins added up to two big wins for the evening. Her champion ewe lamb was selected as the supreme champion ewe and her first place yearling ewe captured the best

bred and owned honors for Lewis.

In the Shropshire division of the breeding sheep competition a big winner was Arlisa Snavelly. Snavelly took the champion and reserve champion titles with a pair of yearling ewes. Snavelly is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Snavelly of 2148 State Road, Lancaster.

Tracey Montes' ewe lamb took the champion title in the Oxford division in the breeding sheep competition. Gina Montes captured the reserve spot in that division with her yearling ewe. Tracey and Gina are the daughters of Marilyn Montes of 103 Skyview Lane in Lititz.
