The bellies closed near limit down pressured by higher than expected frozen belly movement and continuing large kill numbers. Friday's USDA monthly cold storage report is expected to show continued record turkey and poultry stocks and will also reflect early warehousing of frozen pork bellies according to some analysts. The December live hog option posted a loss of 65 points today, closing at \$44.05, up from \$43.85 posted earlier.
