### Acres Grain & Livestock Summaries

**ACRES CORN UPDATE:** Corn overbought conditions in futures ignited selling interest today. These were no fundamental news to maintain the rally. Deliveries posted against December slowed from Tuesday's brisk pace. Prices bounced off of lows late in the session on commercial short covering.

**ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE:** Soybeans futures settled lower but off of lows as professional and commercial sellers turned to buyers late in the session. A sell-off in meal and lower crush margins provided early pressure. Increased interest in January contracting and a quiet export picture caused nervousness, leading to a correction. Meal losses were magnified by technical factors.

**ACRES WHEAT UPDATE:** Wheat futures settled mixed with the nearby pressured by profit taking causing a slight correction. Some export bonus bids were

rejected and resubmitted today for Morocco and Iraq causing additional pressure. Deferrals were supported by commercial interests. Support was noted on ideas of sales of export bonus wheat to USSR which was announced after the close to be 350,000 mt. There are more offers in the making.

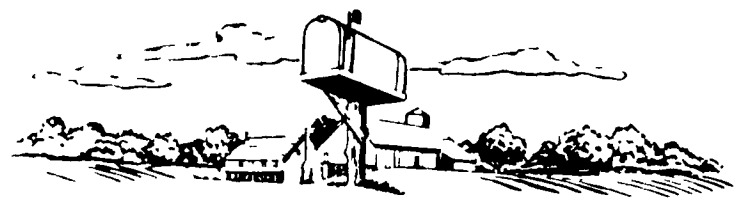
**ACRES CATTLE UPDATE:** Dismal cash news pushed cattle futures lower early. Steady cash at midday prompted a small rally along with commission house buying in the differentials. Panhandle tops today of 68.00 was countered by expectations of lower dressed beef prices. Closes were slightly higher with the December contract losing .07. Market ready cattle are in tight supply, as indicated by a light slaughter today, but product demand is by lack following the holiday. Feeders posted 20-50 point gains on a higher trending average feeder steer price. CME FEEDER CATTLE SETTLEMENT PRICE: 11/30/87 \$77.33 up \$ .38  
ACRES NEXT DAY OUTLOOK: cash - lower futures - steady to lower.

**ACRES HOG UPDATE:** Live hog futures settled after a choppy session with trade on both sides. The product market trended lower as slaughter levels are averaging 334,000 hd per day this week. Gains early are tied to ideas runs would diminish later this week and lend strength to cash prices but lower product prices midday and possibility of lower wholesale ham prices eroded gains. Bellie futures also settled lower.  
ACRES NEXT DAY OUTLOOK: cash - steady to weak futures - steady to better.
