using a liquid and gas under pres-
 sure. He stressed that preservatives
 are not needed for corn silage and
 that if anything is used it should be
 the anhydrous ammonia.

For hay the only preservatives
 Heinrich recommended was propi-
 onic acid and perhaps sodium
 hydroxide.

"Propionic acid is the only
 effective product on the market
 today for hay. It should not be used
 on a regular basis unless you want
 to lose two percent of your baler
 which gets eaten up by the acid,"
 said Heinrich.

Suggested applications:

20-25 percent moisture requires
 15 lbs./ton

25-30 percent moisture requires
 20 lbs./ton

He does not recommend
 exceeding this limit. However, in
 extreme cases of moisture when

perhaps a whole crop is in danger
 of being lost if not harvested,
 above 30 percent moisture requires
 30 lbs./ton. He does not recom-
 mend this except in extreme cases.

"Be picky and ask a lot of ques-
 tions," said Heinrichs. "Before
 using silage preservatives and
 additives make sure you get good
 data. You need more evidence than
 a testimonial. You need a con-
 trolled study. Do alot of reading on
 products. And you need to look
 further than the first line of their
 literature."

Heinrich suggests the farmer
 reads the tags for ingredients.
 Ingredients are listed in order by
 volume. The largest volume ingre-
 dient might give the farmer the
 same results and at the same time
 save him money by avoiding the
 mark-up for the additional
 ingredients.
