

Tomato Growers Meeting

LACKAWANNA CO. — The Northeast Regional Tomato Growers meeting will be held Thursday, January 7 from 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Thompson's Dairy Bar on the Newton-Ransom Boulevard in Lackawanna County.

Dr. Peter Ferretti, Penn State University Extension vegetable specialist, will review the changes in fertilizer recommendations for vegetables in the Penn State soil test reports. Other topics on the program include the importance of nutrient balance for vegetables; pesticide recommendations for 1988; bacterial disease control methods and federal crop insurance for tomatoes.

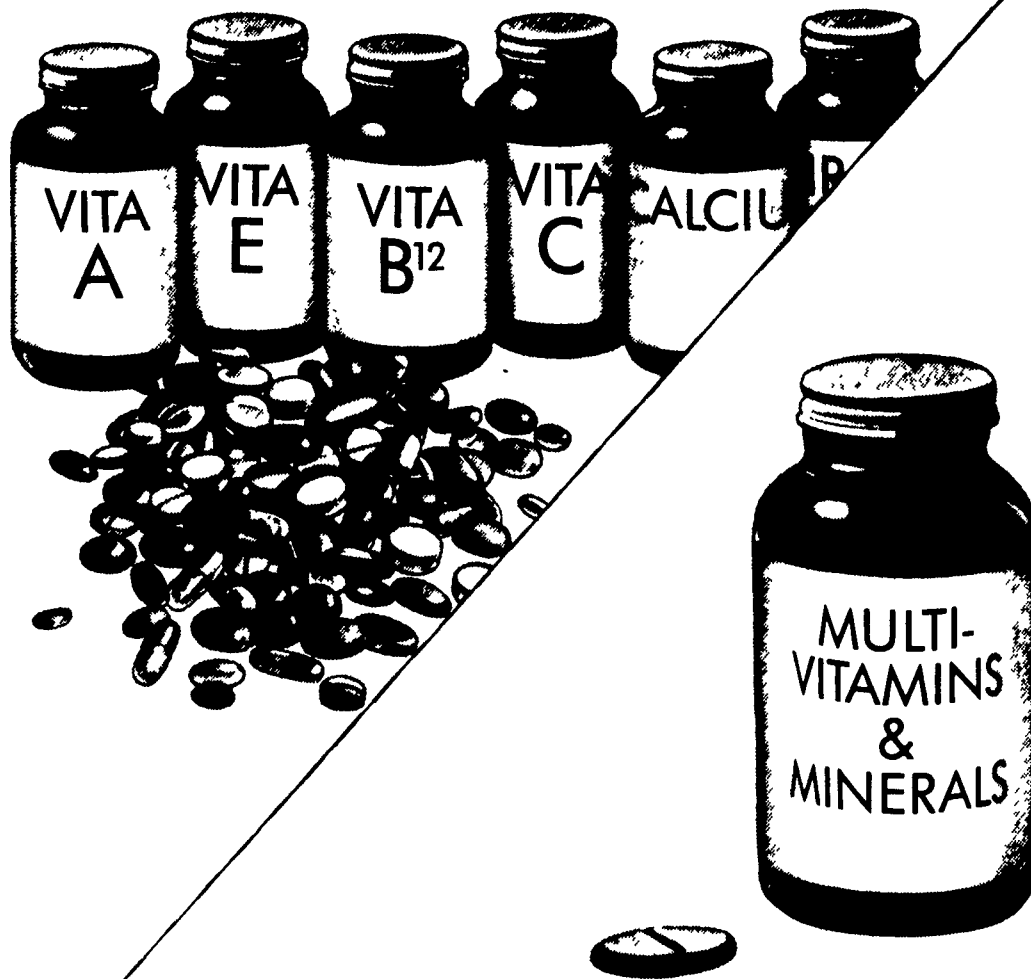
Other speakers are Dr. Cyril Smith, Penn State University; James Garrahan, Pennsylvania

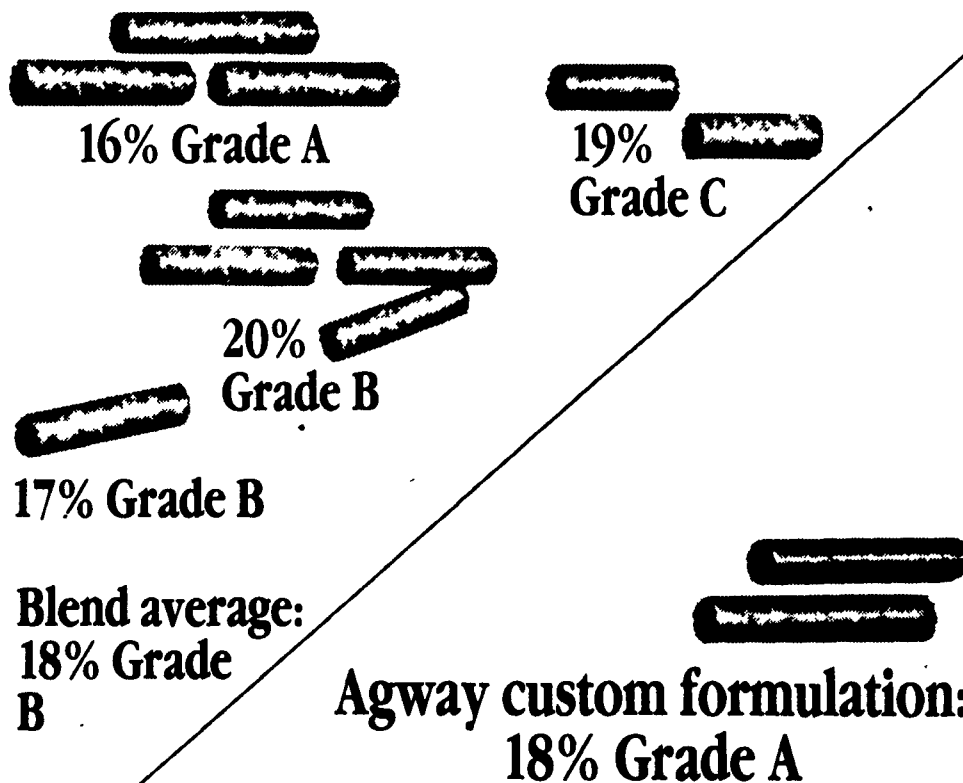
