

510 Angus Entered In National Western Stock Show

ST. JOSEPH, MD — Some 510-head of the top Angus breeding cattle in the United States and Canada have been entered in the Roll of Victory (ROV) Angus Show to take place during the 1988 National Western Stock Show in Denver, January 15 and 16. This is the largest number of registered beef cattle of any breed entered for this year's show.

The Junior Angus Heifer Show scheduled for 7:30 a.m. in the Stadium Arena will start Friday's activities off. The 40 some head entered will be placed by judge Jim Bright, Le Grand, California. The open Angus female show will follow at 8:00 a.m. also in the Arena. Jim Bright and associate judge Dave Medeiros, Turlock, California, will judge the female show. The open bull show will be held on Saturday, January 16 at 9:00 a.m. in the Arena.

All the major Angus events at the National Western will be on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, January 14, 15 and 16.

Judging of Angus cattle actually begins on Thursday, January 14 in the Stadium Arena at 9:00 a.m. with the placing of the Angus sale bulls. Jay Leachman, Bozeman, Montana, will judge this event.

The judging of the pens and carloads of Angus bulls will follow at 12:30 p.m. in the Livestock Center Auction Arena at the Stockyards. Judges for the 21 pens and 6 carloads will be Jim O'Neill, Logan, Iowa; Keith Russell, Platteville, Colorado; and Les Leachman, Bozeman, Montana.

Sale is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. on Friday, January 16. It will be held in the Beef Palace Auction Arena adjacent to the cattle barns.

In addition to selling the 43 consignments, there is a possibility that some females and bulls from the open Angus show may be added to the sale offering as well as flushes. Also, Hazel Caponi and her daughter Janice Zimmerman of Enderlin, North Dakota, are donating an embryo in memory of Hazel's brother George Becker, an avid promoter of the Angus Foundation. The buyer will receive a recipient cow due February bearing the mating of Top Gun and Darling Duchess.

A special highlight of the sale will be the auctioning of an Angus heifer to benefit the Angus Foundation. This heifer is Miss Valorie 751 R F, a January daughter of Premier Valedictorian, donated by Riverside Farms, Hamilton, Texas. Also included with the purchase of the heifer will be embryo transplant services on the heifer provided by Granada Genetics, Wheelock, Texas; insurance coverage through February 15, 1988, donated by Harding and Harding Livestock Insurance Co., Geneva, Illinois; free transportation to the buyer's farm donated by Lathrop Livestock Transportation, Dundee, Illinois; and a choice of semen and A.I. certificates from 12 of the leading Angus sires in the country.

The Angus Foundation is a non-profit organization that supports youth, education and research, and is the sole support for the activities

of the National Junior Angus Association.

The American Angus Association reception will be held on Friday evening, January 15 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Denver Marriott Hotel-City Center.

For those interested, the American Angus Association will be demonstrating its Angus Herd Management Computer Software package during the Angus events at the National Western. The hours for the demonstration are 12:30 to 4:00 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday. They will begin every half hour.

WILL IT PAY TO FEED MILK REPLACER?

- If you can save pigs by feeding milk replacer, it will probably pay for itself. One pig saved is worth at least \$15. If you've got expensive facilities in the middle of a high hog market, you could easily double that figure.

- If you can show more weight gain, especially at weaning, milk replacers might pay. But it will

depend on how much time you spend what the stuff costs you per pig.

- Milk replacer is not cheaper than sows milk. All things figured, it's probably twice as expensive. So don't think of milk replacer as a sow replacer -- unless the sow is short of milk.

- If you're thinking of trying milk replacer, it's easy to get started on a small scale. That's a nice approach. Just remember to keep your scales and pencil handy.

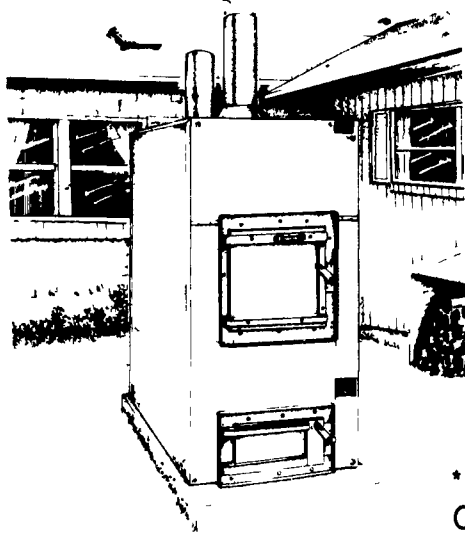
