Hyde To Speak To New York Cattlewomen

SYRACUSE, NY — Gerda Hyde of Oregon, president of the American National Cattlewomen will be the featured speaker at the annual meeting of the New York Cattlewomen Jan. 30 at the Sheraton Inn, Syracuse.

Mrs. Hyde will speak at the Cattlewomen's business meeting which begins at 9 a.m. Jan. 30. She will also be a speaker at the banquet Jan. 29 for the New York Beef Cattlemen's Association and the New York Cattlewomen.

Mrs. Hyde was educated in agricultural economics at the University of California. She and her author/naturalist husband Dayton O. "Hawk" Hyde operate the Yamsi Ranch in southern Oregon. The couple has five children, all whom have taken an active interest in ranch affairs. In addition to the cattle raised on the ranch there is an active timberlands project with trees planted and then harvested on cut-over areas of the ranch. In addition an exclusive "fly fishing resort" is another part of the ranch

activities.

Mrs. Hyde has been an active CowBelle/Cattlewoman since the Klamath (Oregon) Cowbells were organized in 1955. She served as president of the Oregon CowBelles in 1981. On the national level she has served on a number of committees before election to the executive committee, then to vice president, president-elect and currently president of the 10,000 member national organization.

She calls on Cattlewomen both on their state and on the national level "to serve as strong spokespersons who use a positive approach to tell the story of our industry and our products."

New York Cattlewomen will elect a slate of officers, name a "Cattlewoman of the Year" and set priorities for the coming year.

Along with the New York Beef Cattlemen's Association they will be attending the two-day Trade Show, special seminars, the Friday night banquet and the annual Awards Luncheon Saturday Jan. 30.
