Jones terminated buying interest. Further pressure came from ideas that the market had become "toppy" and was due for a technical correction, especially after a steep increase in open interest for back month contracts was released. Higher trending average cash prices provided some support to the front month feeder cattle option, with losses of only 7 points compared to losses in the Feb. live cattle of 67 points.

Pre-estimates for this week's USDA Cattle-on-Feed quarterly report were released as follows:

Dec. Marketings 102.0% 97 -106.6%. This appears to be fairly neutral

for front months and bullish for back months with the light placements and active marketings.

The USDA pre-release estimates for the cold storage report came in at 62.5 million pounds which compared to 35.6 million pounds of frozen bellies on Nov. 30th.


