Udder Health Meeting

One way dairymen can help combat the impact of lower milk prices is to reduce udder infections in an effort to increase production and to cut culling and treatment costs.

Another way is to improve milk

quality and qualify for premium payments.

To help dairymen accomplish these goals, four Udder Health Meetings have been scheduled in Lancaster and Chester Counties. Dairymen, herdsman, milkers and other interested people are invited to attend.

The meetings will discuss topics related to milking equipment and milking practices as well as the prevention and treatment of mastitis. New information about liner slips, teat shields, pre-dipping, the role of selenium and antibiotic residues will be presented.

These meetings are being conducted by the Penn State Extension Service of Lancaster, Chester and

Dauphin Counties. Instructors will be local veterinarians and Extension Agents. Pre-registration is required. All sessions run from 9:45 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Dates and places are listed below.
