Virginia, Washington Declared Free Of Bovine Tuberculosis

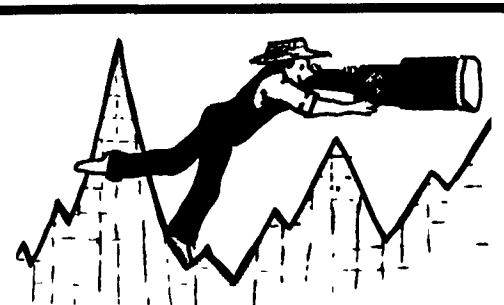
WASHINGTON, D.C. — The U.S. Department of Agriculture is declaring Virginia and Washington as the 35th and 36th states designated free of bovine tuberculosis.

According to Donald L. Houston, administrator of USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, tuberculosis-free recognition is based on a state's freedom from the disease for a specified time and on its compliance with the uniform methods and rules of the state-federal cooperative tuberculosis eradication program.

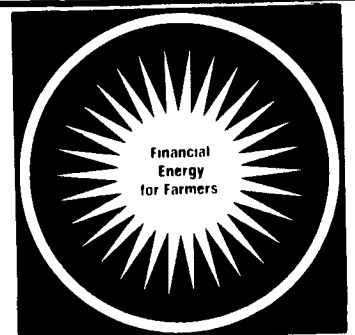
Cattle and bison from Virginia and Washington can now be marketed more easily, since many prospective buyers prefer to buy from states designated free of the disease.

Incidence of the disease nationwide has been reduced dramatically since its peak earlier in this century, but outbreaks of bovine tuberculosis have been detected even in accredited-free states, Houston said. He warned against complacency about bovine TB. "Tuberculosis will continue to be a threat to dairy and beef cattle until the last infection has been eliminated," he said.

Bovine TB is a serious, infectious disease that results in weight loss, general debilitation, and sometimes death in infected animals. It affects bison and cattle similarly.
