premiums by independent milk handlers. Most independents have reached agreements with RCMA to participate in the over-order-premium program, with Farmland reported the remaining holdout. The large independent is reportedly heavily courting producers, in order to carve out of the Order 2 market their own supply of raw milk, and weaken efforts of RCMA to effectively negotiate over-order prices for all dairy producers in that federal order jurisdiction.

Combining the January 50-cent cut in support price, the 2.5 cent per hundredweight Gramm-Rudman assessment, and sluggish

dairy industry economics, Collins projected an overall dairy price decrease through 1988 of about 60 cents per hundredweight from 1987 levels.

"Thus, we expect to see as many dairy producers go out in 1988 as did in 1987," he predicted.

Current production increases in large dairy states, including California and Wisconsin, as well as a dairying boom in Texas, point to further support price drops in 1989.
