
## Ida's Notebook


The conference will begin Friday afternoon with workshops and other related activities. Meridel LeSueur a longtime activist from Minnesota will give the keynote

address Friday evening. A onewoman play "Ain't I A Woman," presented by Shirlene Holmes of Carbondale, Illinois will portray the life of Sojourner Truth, an important agent of social change during the mid 1800's.

Workshop topics for the weekend will include "Is the Farm Crisis Really Over?" "Farmer -Labor Solidarity," "Women in Politics," "International Trade Issues," "Why Isn't My Church Speaking To Me?" and "Displacement From the Land." Presenters will come from across the country and Canada.

The first "Harvesting Our Potential" conference was held in January 1986 with 400 women from Iowa attending. The conference has gained wide recognition and it is anticipated that over 500 women from all over the United States will be attending the March conference.




