

the maximum amount one can add to a seam allowance before altering a pattern design.

5. Adequate ease (4" to 6") is given by all pattern companies in coat or jacket patterns, thus ease doesn't need to closely calculated. 6. If skirts or slacks are the next project, waist and hip measurements must be known in order to buy the pattern. Hips can be measured in one of two places. This

can be any place 6 to 12 inches

below the waist. Take three mea-

sures if you have a protruding

Measure in a seated position, the distance from waist

over hip to chair. Measure full curvature and hip.

abdomen. First, measure 4 inches below the waist, second measure 7 inches below waist and a final one should be taken over the fullest part of the body.

7. Select your pattern size by comparing your measurements with those found on the back of the pattern catalogues. Calculate the total amount of fullness needed by adding your measurements plus the basic ease that is provided by the pattern companies.

FLAT PATTERN MEASURING

After you have taken your measurements and purchased your pattern, begin phase number two of fitting. Remove the pattern from the envelope and prepare it by trimming away excess tissue paper and press it with a dry iron to remove packaging creases. A steam iron may shrink the pattern paper.

Place large pattern pieces on a large flat surface. With a yardstick or a plastic see-thru ruler, measure pattern pieces at the key area (illustrated) between seam allowances. Do not include the seam allowances in calculations.

Measure all pattern pieces using the illustrations as guides. Write the measured number directly onto the tissue. Do not measure across

the darts but begin and end before and after each one. Crotch line is almost always drawn on pants patterns. To find your own crotch depth do the following. In a seated position, measure the distance from the waist to the chair bottom over the fullest part of the hip. Be careful to measure the full curvature of the hip to allow for hip spreading.

After pattern measurements are completed, calculate your totals. Example:

Measure the bust area of each (front and back) pattern piece. Front bust width measures 8-inch-

es and back measures 8-inches. Add these two figures and multiply by 2 to calculate the total bust measurement (8+8=16x2=32-inch pattern bust measurement). Record this number on the chart under pattern measurement. Compare this nattern dimension to the total amount needed. If a minus number is recorded, you will have to alter the pattern to fit. A plus number provides enough fullness. Excess fullness can be removed by sewing seams deeper than ⁵/₄ -inch or by pleating out fullness in pattern pieces.

FAMILY LIVING ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBERS NEEDED


