

# PA Holstein Progressive Breeder Awards

STATE COLLEGE — Twenty-two Pennsylvania Holstein members were honored with the prestigious Progressive Breeder Registry Award at the PA Holstein Convention in Lancaster. The requirements for the award include:

- 1) Herd must have a minimum of 20 cows in the milking herd which bear the owner's prefix.
- 2) Cow's bearing the herd's prefix must represent at least 75% of the total milking herd.
- 3) Herd BAA% from the last herd classification must be in the top 30% nationally (103.4% or higher in 1987).
- 4) DHIR herd lactation average must be in the top 30% of the DHIR regional average which for Pennsylvania was 21,481m 768f in 1987.

Keystone Farms, Easton received the award for the 30th time this year while eleven breeders received the award for the first time.
