To Hamilton, that's what shows and demonstrations are all about. A chance to show off new equipment and new innovations. And the opportunity to hear what farmers have to say.

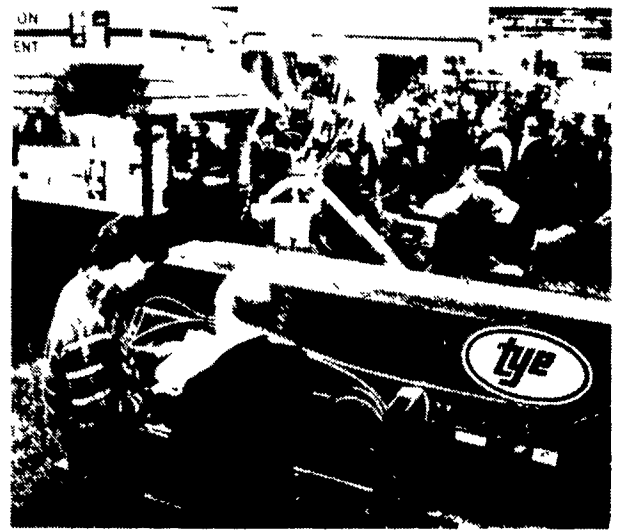
Hamilton has been big on shows since 1939 when we first exhibited at Farm Show. That was our second year in business. We're still there.

Today, we are the show people for 40 manufacturers and the hundreds of dealers who carry their lines.

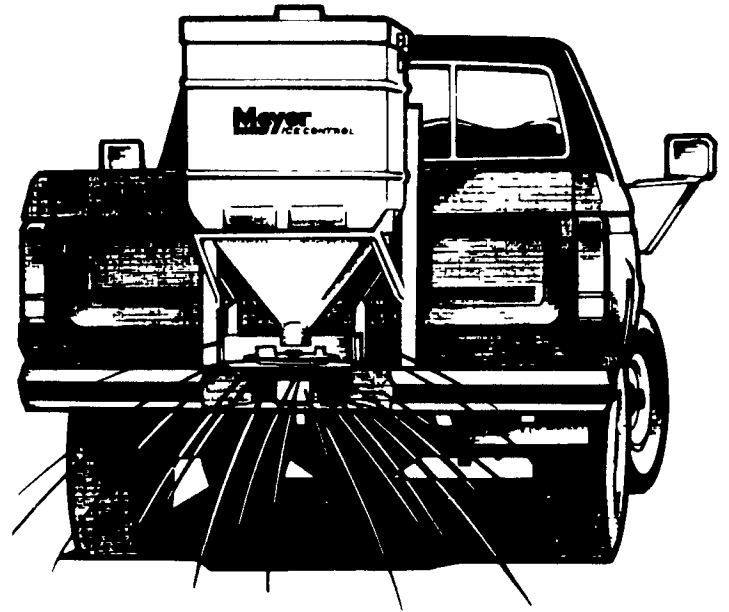
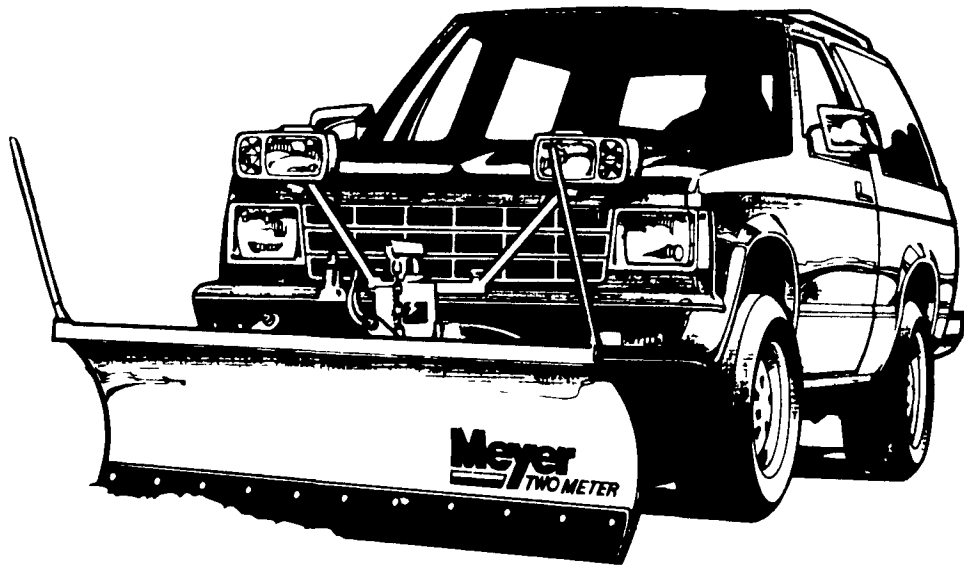
A big first in 1946 for Hamilton and farmers alike was an elevator that could handle either grain or baled hay. The firm sold out in 1986.

What's new down the road? We'll show you next time you stop around at our exhibit.

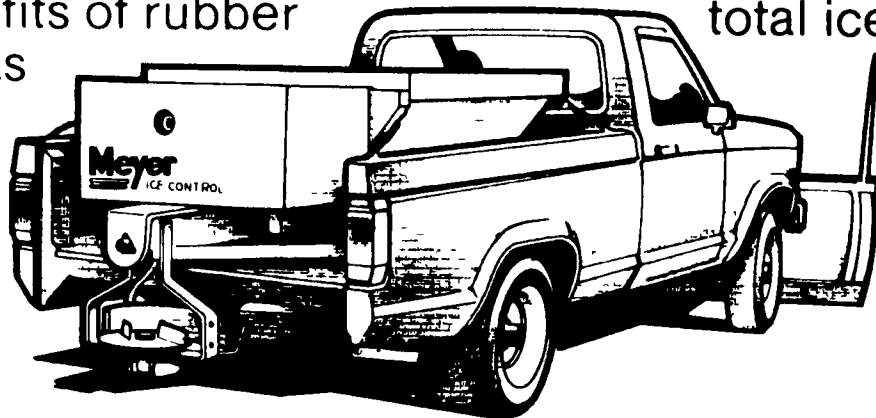


Hamilton Equipment has exhibited at Pennsylvania Farm Show since 1939. It is one of a dozen shows for Hamilton annually.

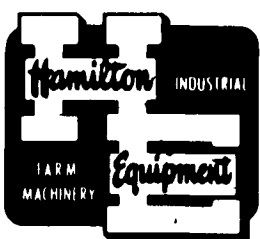
