Acres Corn Update: Com futures closed lower from 1 to 1-1/4 cents lower pressured by forecasts for rain for portions of the growing belt Further pressure was exerted by sharp declines in the soybean pit and profit-taking The latest loan redemption figures, showing 88 million bushels, added further downward pres sure Support came from firm basis levels and slack country movement

Acres Soybean Update: soybean futures managed to grate most of yesterday's gains with selling linked to forecasts for rain over the next several days in key western corn and soybean growing areas Light buying midday was in response to reports that rain coverage in parges of lowa was less than forecast Losses today ranged from 5-1/4 to 6-1/2 cents with November closing at \$6 91-3/4, down 6-1/2 cents Soybean meal mirrored losses in the beans while oil closed sharply higher on fund buying

Acres Wheat Update: Wheat futures closed higher from 1 to 1-3/4 cents today with buying attributed to ideas China was back in the market Further support came from ideas that the delegation from India was returning to Washington, with many looking for more export bonus announcements in the near future. Some selling was noted on forecasts for rain in the few days July closed 1 1/2 higher at \$3 24-1/2 with December gaining only a penny at \$3 4250

Acres Cattle Update: Cattle futures settled higher with most months settling at or near session highs Buying was attributed to cash market strength and active boxed beef movement at higher prices Advances in June were magnified by its sharp discount to cash as it became the spot month after April's expiration at noon Feeder cattle mirrored activity in the live cattle pit with gains recorded from 35 to 60 points PRE-ESTIMATES FOR QUARTERLY CATTLE ON HEED REPORT

Ideas that cash hog openings tomorrow would be lower pared further gains, along with lower wholesale prices midday. April expired quietly at noon with a \$44.50 settlement, which was down 20.
