CORN MARKETS HIGHER ON CONTINUED LIGHT COUNTRY SELLING AND STRONG BASIS LEVELS. SOYBEANS MIXED BUT MOSTLY HIGHER. CRUSH MARGIN CONTINUES TO SUPPORT SOYBEAN PRICES.
