WHEAT MARKETS MIXED SUPPORTED BY STRONG SOYBEAN COMPLEX, LIGHT COUNTRY SELLING AND MODERATE EXPORT INTEREST. CORN MARKETS DECLINED AS REDEMPTIONS FROM CCC CORN CATALOGUE CONTINUES TO FILL NEARBY NEEDS. SOYBEAN MARKETS CONTINUE UPWARD SPIRAL, SUPPORTED BY RECENT U.S.D.A. SUPPLY AND DEMAND REPORT AND STRONG EXPORT INTEREST FOR SOYBEAN MEAL.

PRECIPITATION PROVIDED MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE IN MONTANA, WESTERN NORTH DAKOTA, SOUTH DAKOTA, NEBRASKA, AND NORTHERN KANSAS WHEAT PRODUCING AREAS. WINTER WHEAT WAS MOSTLY GOOD TO FAIR EXCEPT IN THE NORTHERN GREAT PLAINS WHERE CONDITION WAS MOSTLY FAIR. RAIN PROVIDED MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE IN THE NORTHERN AND CENTRAL GREAT PLAINS. HEADING WAS 19 PERCENT FINISHED AND BEHIND NORMAL IN 7 OF THE 20 MAJOR PRODUCING STATES. IN TEXAS, HOT, DRY WEATHER CAUSED FIELDS TO TURN COLOR IN CENTRAL AREAS. DRYLAND FIELDS WERE UNDER MOISTURE STRESS. WHEAT ENTERED THE SOFT DOUGH STAGE IN SOUTHERN AREAS OF THE STATE. SPRING WHEAT SEEDING IS 87 PERCENT COMPLETE AND PLANTING AHEAD OF AVERAGE. CORN WAS 70 PERCENT SEEDED. CORN PLANTING SURGED AHEAD OF NORMAL IN MAJOR PRODUCING AREAS. INADEQUATE MOISTURE RESTRICTED SEED GERMINATION, PLANTING, AND CROP GROWTH IN SOME CORN BELT STATES. SOYBEANS WERE 21 PERCENT PLANTED IN THE 19 MAJOR PRODUCING STATES. PLANTING WAS NEAR OR ABOVE THE 20 PERCENT COMPLETION MARK IN MOST CORN BELT STATES AND PROGRESSED SLIGHTLY AHEAD OF NORMAL IN THE CENTRAL GREAT PLAINS AND DELTA.

HAITI BOUGHT 13,600 TONNES OF 13 PERCENT PROTEIN HARD RED SPRING WHEAT UNDER GSM-102 FINANCING FOR MAY ARRIVAL. MOROCCO RECEIVED A PL480 TITLE I PURCHASE AUTHORIZATION TO BUY ABOUT 170,000 TONNES OF U.S. WHEAT FOR MAY/SEPT SHIPMENT.

SOUTH KOREA'S NATIONAL LIVESTOCK COOPERATIVES FEDERATION OVERNIGHT BOUGHT 50,000 TONNES OF U.S. NO. 3 YELLOW CORN FOR JULY/AUG SHIPMENT. ALGERIA BOUGHT 9,000 TONNES OF EUROPEAN SUNOIL. NORWAY TENDERED FOR 75,000 TONNES OF OPTION-ORIGIN SOYBEANS FOR AUG/SEPT/OCT SHIPMENT AND EXPECTED TO BE OF ARGENTINE ORIGIN.
