CASH GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOWER IN A REACTION TO RECENT UPTURNS. WIDELY SCATTERED SHOWERS DID VERY LITTLE TO ALLEVIATE DROUGHT CONDITIONS OVER THE NATION BUT GRAIN PRICES BACKED UP. RECENT PRICE UPTURNS FAILED TO FLOOD ELEVATORS WITH COUNTRY MOVEMENT OF GRAIN TO MARKET AS MOST OFFERINGS IN STRONG HANDS.
