My father means a lot to me and my family. He takes us to our cabin over the summer and winter. He takes me hunting and fishing trips to Canada and supplies me with plenty of work.

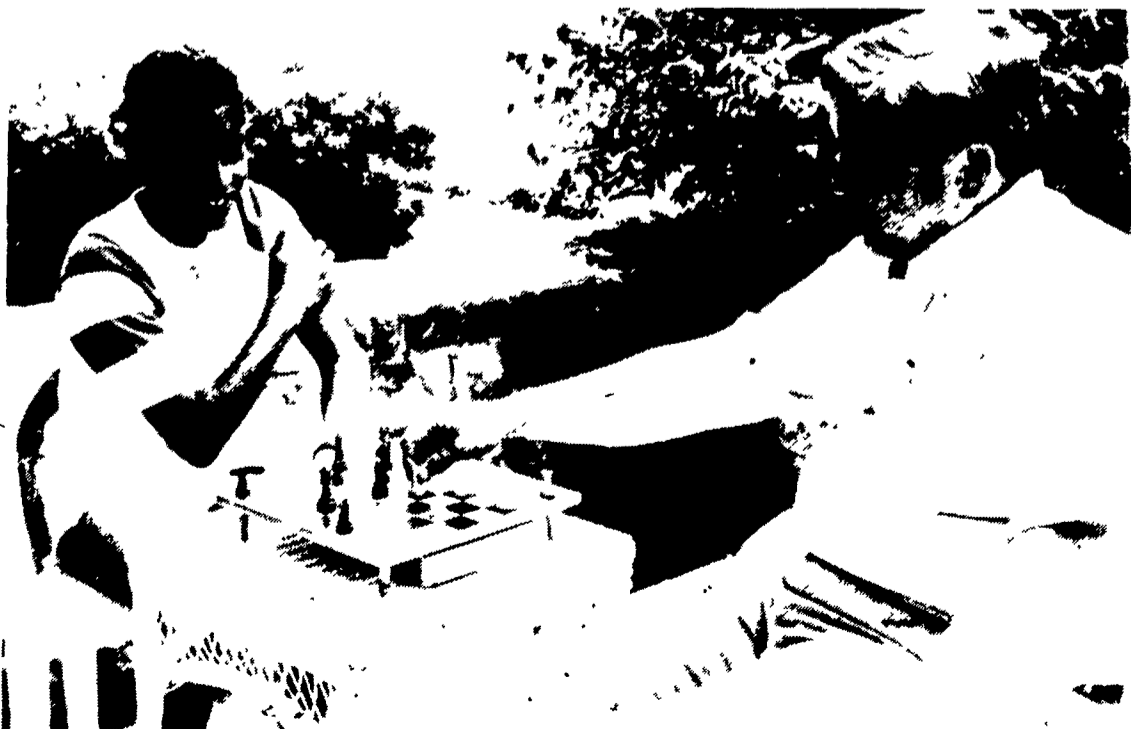
