Dairy Goats To Show At 1988 NAILE

LOUISVILLE, KY — A dairy goat show will be added to the listing of events at the 1988 North American International Livestock Exposition. Harold Workman, executive director of the NAILE, also has confirmed that Bill Bell of Taylorsville, KY, will be dairy goat superintendent, and Judy Schad of Pekin, IN, will be assistant dairy goat superintendent.

The dairy goat show will be one of the first events to take place at the 1988 North American International Livestock Exposition, with dates set for November 5 & 6. The show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association.

According to Messrs, Workman and Bell, total premium money for the first year will be \$4,705. Mr. Bell also noted that several major goat breeds will be represented at the 1988 NAILE, including: Alpine, La Mancha, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, and Toggenburg. Recorded grades will also be included in goat competition,

bringing the total number of breed classes to seven.


The popularity of dairy goats has grown in recent years, primarily among part-time farmers and small farmers. According to many producers, goats are inexpensive to keep, perform a very desirable

clean-up/companionship function on the farm and produce milk which is highly digestible and nutritious. Supt. Bell said approximately 200 animals are expected to show in November. "Addition of the dairy goat show to the North American International schedule of events is a step forward for our breed since the NAILE is such an important exposition", said Bell. Continuing, he confirmed that goat shows in November will include group classes, showmanship classes for young people, and competition for both dry does and milking

does.

In addition to the dairy goat show, five other livestock types will be featured at the 1988 North American International Livestock Exposition, including dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, quarter horses and draft horses.




