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ACRES SOYBEAN UPDATE: Soybean futures, except for the spot July option, opened and closed locked up the 30 cent daily trading limit. July closed 69 cents higher at \$9.485, Tomorrow's limits will be 45 cents for beans. Today's gains were attributed to yesterday's bullishly construed USDA reports in addition to weather forecasts predicting return to hot and dry conditions by this weekend. The market continues to be inverted with November trading at a 7-1/2 cent premium to January.

ACRES WHEAT UPDATE: Wheat futures closed sharply higher today gaining from 10-3/4 to 17 cents. Forecasts for a return of hot

and dry weather prompted buying along with spillover strength from the neighbring bean and corn pits. Temperatures are expected to top out above 100 degrees again with little or no rainfall expected. Yesterday's USDA reports showing a 50% decrease in spring and durum added further support.

ACRES CATTLE UPDATE: Live and feeder cattle sharply lower to limit down on the front months with losses tied ongoing grain strength. Herd liquidation worries continued to plague the market as yesterday's pasture condition reports were the worst ever in history. Further selling was
