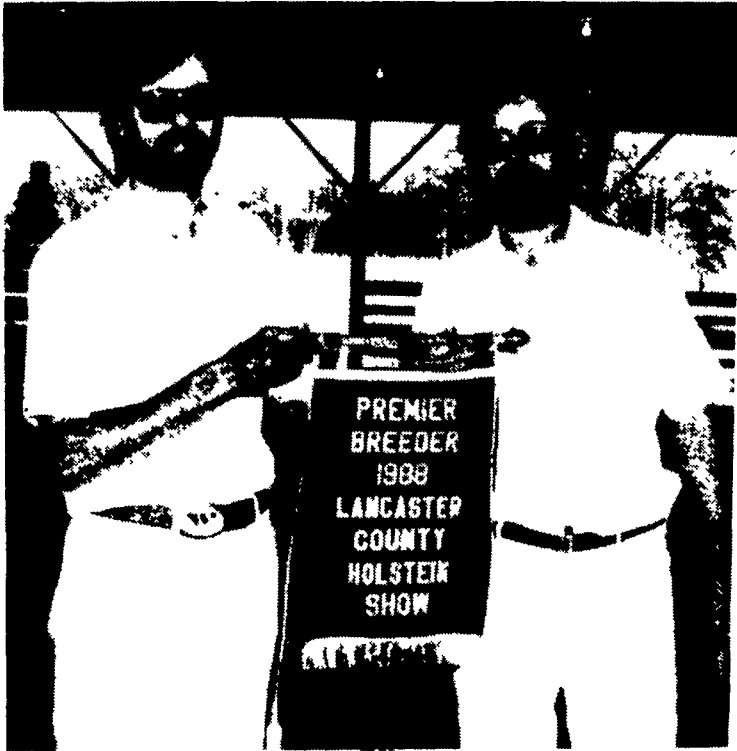
John Brubaker of Christiana brought out his herd's best cow and took Reserve Grand Champion. C Harliff Shick Amanda took first in her class at the competition

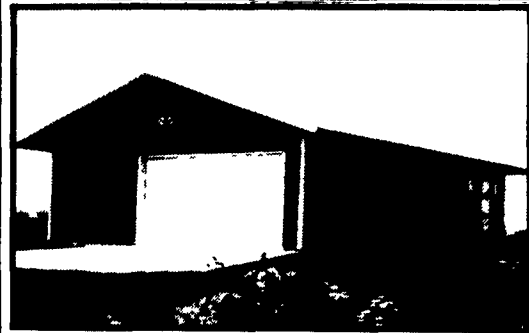
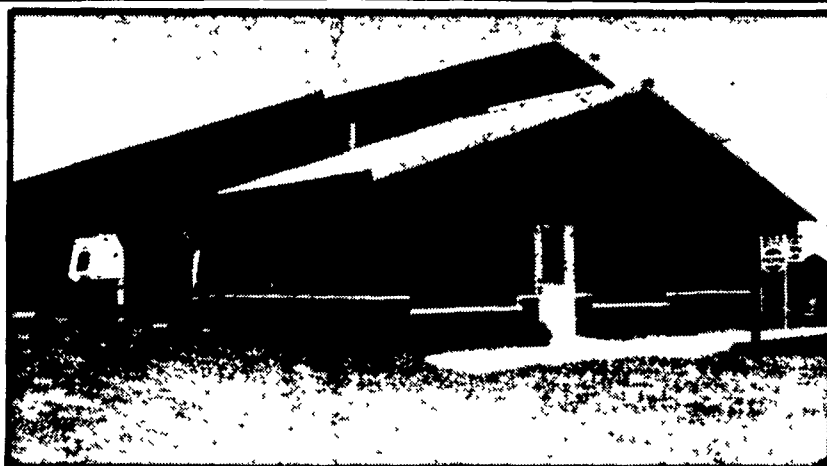
Pennsylvania Holstein Association served as Breed Manager for the show and noted that the num-
